ACHC is a Cairns based not-for-profit charity, dedicated to providing social and affordable housing for individuals and families across Far North Queensland.

Operating as a Tier 2 Community Housing Provider (CHP) registered with the National Regulatory System for Community Housing (NRSCH), ACHC provides housing to people on the Queensland Department of Housing's register of need.

ACHC goes beyond providing shelter and connects customers with specialised support services to ensure successful tenancies and holistic care.

With a portfolio of over 670 properties and approximately 1,250 residents spanning Mossman to Babinda, ACHC bears witness to stories of resilience and triumph, helping empower lives through housing.

Current Projects

New complex in Earlville, Cairns.

In partnership with the Queensland Government, ACHC has commenced the construction of 30 homes in Cairns. This build will provide 30 modern social homes and represents a significant step forward in enhancing housing accessibility and quality for the Cairns community. This investment will replace 14 aging dwellings with contemporary, purpose-built accommodation tailored to meet the diverse needs of residents. In preparation for the redevelopment, ACHC has assisted previous customers to secure suitable alternative accommodation, ensuring a smooth transition, and demonstrating a commitment to community welfare.



News

Four more homes for large families.

ACHC has recently purchased four, four-bedroom established homes that will accommodate large families' needs. These are all located in south Cairns, in close proximity to essential services.



Recently Completed Projects

Cottage Renovation

ACHC renovated eight previously unused cottages in Cairns to provide safe, secure housing for women over 55, the fastest-growing cohort of people experiencing homelessness in Australia. This initiative not only supported a vulnerable demographic but also increased the local supply of affordable housing.

Safe Places

ACHC built four three-bedroom homes in Cairns for women and children escaping domestic and family violence. In partnership with the Womens Centre FNQ, customers receive specialised wrap-around support services tailored to their unique needs.

Secure Complex

ACHC built a 10-unit complex for women and children escaping domestic and family violence. "Focusing on women who are escaping domestic and family violence and the growing group of single homeless women, this complex will provide much needed safe, secure accommodation for these women and their children." - Federal Leichhardt MP Warren Entsch.

A responsive maintenance system allows customers to easily request and track repairs through a robust reporting framework.

ACHC partners with trusted contractors who understand customer needs and deliver quality, cost-effective services that extend asset life.

Customers also have access to emergency repairs via an after-hours phone number, along with clear procedures, service expectations, and opportunities to provide feedback for continuous improvement.

Tenancies are managed with the unique circumstances of each situation in mind.
